From the Pastor's Desk Pastor Dick Hotchkin

On the wall of one of the catacombs, the burial tunnels under the city of Rome, is the faint inscription of a man with a cross. Underneath the cross are these words, "Alexos worships the Christ." Gone today are the glory that was Greece and the splendor that was Rome. Forever stilled are the marching feet of Caesar's columns. But the Christ whom Alexos worshiped is enthroned in the hearts of millions of people, and his cross crowns thousands of stately cathedrals and village chapels. This Jesus is the one unique figure in all of history. He is God the Son, come to earth to save us human beings.

It is because of this that Jesus could say in truth, "I am the way." It is in Jesus that life for us has meaning here in time, and a glory hereafter in eternity. Neither theologies, philosophies, nor ideologies have the power to give us that. Ideas do have persuasive powers. Ideologies, however, do not control us as profoundly as do people. A man does not become a good husband and father by believing in monogamy and by understanding the sociological importance of the family. People make him a good husband and father – a wife and children whom he loves, and who love him and count on him.

As Christians, we may know the Church's doctrines and be persuaded that no teaching about life and the universe can compare with Christianity. Deep down, however, we know that behind whatever we believe about the faith, there is the spiritually powerful, magnetic, commanding, and comforting person of its Lord, Jesus the Christ. We are drawn to Jesus, as to no ideology or theology. If someone asks us, "What is the way of the Christian?" we really have but one answer, "The way is Christ himself." You and I are not saved by embracing an idea; we are saved by Jesus.

Attached to Jesus, we believers become attached to his Church and to the people Jesus died to redeem – all people. It is Jesus himself, God come into view, with his tenderness and strength, with the love that drove him to the cross for you and me – it is Jesus that is the "way," the fountainhead of all other worthy loves.




Feed-A-Family Bill Haase


Strengthen the Church ~ June 8, 2025 (Pentecost Sunday) Mission Committee

- The Search Committee's work continues with the review of a proposed informational letter which will be sent to the Congregation in the week following the Board meeting.

- The roof over the elevator is being assessed to determine if an architectural change to the roofline will help with ongoing leaking.
- The administration of the church webpage and creation of a new webpage to happen over the summer months was discussed. The Board moved the Web Administrator responsibilities to the church office as an office function.
- Pastor Hotchkin noted church staff has indicated more people are watching Sunday Worship services on the internet. It's nice to see members who have returned from warmer winter climates, in addition to new visitors.

Good News!

You continue to fulfill your pledges, and we're grateful for your commitment. While monthly giving is currently below the projected monthly budget, it's important to note that – thanks to several pledges paid in full – total donations for the year are actually above budget and more generous than last year. Thank you all for doing your part!

Year to date, we are currently operating at a \$6,621 loss, meaning our expenses have exceeded our income. However, don't lose heart—we anticipate moving much closer to our balanced budget target with the upcoming allocation from the Comstock Fund. Thanks to your continued generosity and the thoughtful decision to keep the Comstock Funds invested (earning interest) until our checking account reached a lower balance, we're positioned to recover and return to a positive financial footing.

One of my goals for this year is to transition to a narrative budget—a format that integrates dollars, people, and mission into a story. Rather than focusing solely on line items, a narrative budget reveals how our financial choices bring our shared values and ministries to life. The traditional budget will remain in the background to support the details, but the real focus will be on OUR story.

So, what is our story?

- Who are we as a community of faith?
- Where are we headed?
- What do we have to share with others?
- What are the pillars of our church?

Are you passionate about:

- Serving others?
- Growing and celebrating our faith?
- Connecting and sharing with our community?

Answering these questions grounds us in our purpose and **inspires how we connect our financial resources with the life of our church**. It's not just about numbers—it's about impact, mission, and meaning. Let's use our gifts faithfully and boldly to be a light in our community.
