From the Pastor's Desk

Jesus arose from the dead! This is not an allegory, or a myth, or a parable. It happened! Jesus arising from the dead is a solid event in history, unlike any other event, but an event! Jesus died ... he rose again.

Nor did Jesus suffer and die to teach a lesson – like how to be brave, or how to be loyal to our convictions. Jesus suffered and died and rose again to overcome the enemy, Satan, and to pay for the sins of the world. Jesus suffered and died and rose again to redeem the world, to recover humanity, to restore that which had been lost, to free the spiritually imprisoned, to save the world.

It is not strange that people rub their eyes and say, "How can this be so?" Whoever heard a claim like this before?

The wonder is that we can believe it at all. This itself is a miracle of God. Most of us have heard of the event since we were children. The wonder of it may have been lost in the repetition. But, it is the world's greatest wonder! Stepping on the moon is a trifle compared with it. After all, to say that God would become a human being and die for us – is this not a truth more fantastic than anything the world has ever heard?

The cross and the empty tomb are the measure of God's love. Unless we can accept this radical love of God, both Jesus' death and resurrection become impossible to believe. Such love can never seem reasonable, but is glorious beyond imagination.

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. (John 3:16)


Membership Declaration Cards


Support our ministries from anywhere. Go to the App Store or Google Play to download the Vanco Mobile app for free.

You can choose to cover the donation processing fees by adding a small amount on top of your gift. Click the button to opt in.




5. Complete Your Donation
