From the Pastor's Desk Pastor Dick Hotchkin

We are almost afraid to think of what God may want to give us. Perhaps it is much more than we want. What does it really mean when God wants to give us salvation, or the kingdom, or life abundant? If salvation, what are saved from, and what are we saved for? If the kingdom, what is the style of life of that kingdom? If the abundant life, just how does God define that kind of life? It may be that we are reluctant to have any of it – salvation or the kingdom or the abundant life.

God sets out to save us from our sins, their guilt, and their power. That may not be what we want. We know that it's wrong to hold a grudge, but we may secretly enjoy it. We know that it's wrong to ignore the needs of our neighbors, but we may hate to get involved. We know that it's wrong to pile up wealth when others are in need, but it's fun to see the pile grow.

And if God gives us a kingdom – which God has promised as a gift through Jesus – what changes may we have to make in our manner of life? We are not sure that we really mean it when we pray, "Thy kingdom come." And what does God mean by the abundant life? Perhaps it doesn't include expensive recreation or even many things we have counted as necessities.

We are given the gift of salvation, the kingdom, the abundant life. This means that we lose the comfort of being average and unimportant. It means that we lose the pleasures that we find in self-indulgence and in self-pity. It means that we are enlisted in a kingdom, to take orders from our king, and find life by losing it.

Little wonder that we may pause. Is this really what we want? Deep down, we know that it is, cost what it will. There is no other option if we truly want to experience fullness of life!

Membership Declaration Cards

Membership Declaration Cards are required annually. Submitting a card each year is important because it keeps our membership records accurate, helps the church stay in touch with you, and affirms your commitment as a member of First Congregational UCC. A former member may re-establish good and regular standing by signing such a card at any time.

'I declare that I am a member of First Congregational United Church of Christ of Alpena, Michigan.'

- Meal Serving Group 4:00–5:30 p.m. (serving the meal and cleanup)


This is a wonderful opportunity to serve our neighbors and share fellowship together. We are asking for just a **once-a-month commitment**.


Mission Committee - Neighbors in Need Pat Garant


