A Word From Our Minister: "A New Year of Activities"

Things were different for me and for the Church during the last three months of last year. Because I was on "sabbatical" until Dec. 16, I did not need to plan sermons or studies or extra services of any kind. **The Rev. Gene Bacon** did all that in my place, and I would like to say that he did a fine job! Thank you, Gene, for your ministry; and thank you, church members, for giving me three months to sort through stuff in my life. Three rooms in the Lower Level now have bookshelves and file cabinets full of stuff I had accumulated over 35 years of ordained ministry. I can actually put my hands on them now!

As we launch a new year of program initiatives, I am excited at what's in store. Now, I do not expect any of you to try to do "all" of the following new ventures, but I would like you to spread the word among your friends. Some of these studies and activities may strike them as valuable, and (please let them know) **they are invited!**

Inside this Newsletter, you will see an article about our new Tuesday "in home" Bible Study that will meet *at the McNeil home* at 5:00 pm. You will also see an article about my new Wednesday 1:15 pm "**Serenity**" **Bible Study** based on the traditional "12-Steps" of recovery from addiction. I find the *12 steps process* very helpful, even if a person is not wrestling with a specific dependency. Tell your friends.

You will also see a list of the "**Monday Mid-day Movies**" that I'll be showing at noon in Fellowship Hall. These are movies that make you think!

There are three more new activities that do not have articles in this Newsletter, so I'll tell you about them right now:

First, the annual "Week of Prayer for Christian Unity" service will be held at Trinity Episcopal Church this year, on **Wednesday, January 23**, starting with a **soup supper at 6:00 pm** followed by a multi-church worship service at 7:00 pm.

Second, on Sunday afternoon, Jan. 20. at 3:00 pm, 14-year old Jona Hauff will be at the piano on our stage as he and I start a brand-new kids and youth **song & dance** performance group called "**Salt & Light**" Singers. We will practice for an hour each week, learning fun songs to perform (here & on tour). Kids have to be **old** enough to read, and **bold enough** to perform loudly, with **energy!** Tell the children and teenagers you know who might like song & dance. Call the church and give us their name, and age, and phone number. Thanks!

Third, I am resuming my **Thursday Theology Class at 1:00 pm** on January 3 up in Fellowship Hall. We will pick up the lectures on "Jesus and His Jewish Influences" with (Jan. 3) Jesus' Jewish Lineage, (Jan 10) Herod the Great, (Jan 17) Was Jesus a Pharisee?, (Jan. 24) Pontius Pilate, and (Jan 31) Herod Agrippa. We watch a DVD... which I frequently interrupt for discussion.

Board of Directors December 2018 Meeting Highlights

- ◆ The Congregation is beginning to receive Christmas Cards for the season. Thank you to all.
- ◆ Financial reports for the month show we are in good shape for the end of the year. Thank you!
- ◆ We reviewed the 2019 budget including proposed staff raises. Board approved it to be sent to the congregation for vote at the Annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday, Jan. 27 after worship.
- ◆ **Martin Luther King Jr. Committee** is requesting funds for this year’s drama-in-the-schools event on Jan 21. A request will be made of the congregation and the Mission Committee to help.
- ◆ Janet Artley requested moving funds from the “Memorial Garden Walkway” Fund to “Capital Reserve” Fund. It was approved by the Board, but Comstock Fund Committee approval may also be needed.
- ◆ Property Committee reported that Leavesley Construction has looked at the front doors (which do not completely close) and reported that we need new pivots for the doors. Edith Gerber will contact Alpena Glass to see if they can get the parts. The elevator roof is leaking again. TRC roofing has been contacted and will see what they can do.
- ◆ Worship Committee reports that **John & Joyce Murphy and Ginny Titus** will host the Christmas Eve Reception. Thank you to these three new members for volunteering to serve in this way.
- ◆ Mission Committee will meet to discuss end-of-the-year expenditures and make plans for 2019.
- ◆ Stewardship Committee reports that they collected 59 pledges this year. General Fund: \$123,000 and Mission Fund: \$12,600. **This is \$22,000 below the target of \$145,000.**
- ◆ Rev. Bacon has been visiting with Heather Bodem at Medilodge following her brain surgery. She is progressing, but still has blurry vision, some loss of hearing, and significant vertigo/dizziness.
- ◆ Board requested care letters be sent to our shut-in’s for Christmas. (They were mailed Dec. 23.)

With an eye toward Martin Luther King’s Day on January 21, this month’s movies will deal with **race relations in America**.

- Jan. 7 — *“Briars in the Cotton Patch”* (2012, 57 minutes) The Story of Koinonia Farms, Americus, Georgia, which became the home of “Habitat For Humanity” as well. This documentary, narrated by Andrew Young, examines the remarkable events of a small Christian community in the South where whites and blacks chose to live and work together as equals despite the brutal & frightening consequences.
- Jan. 14 — *“Race to Freedom: the Underground Railroad”* (2013, 95 minutes)
- Jan. 21 — *“Selma”* (2014, 128 minutes) Dr. King leads a march in the face of violence.
- Jan. 28 — *“Decoration Day”* (2002, 98 minutes) James Garner, a retired judge, is asked to look into why a black man is refusing to accept the Medal of Honor.
