From the Pastor's Desk

The earthly Jesus possessed none of the usual credentials worthy of the historian's research. Jesus was not rich; he was not learned; he belonged to no royal family; he led no army. Jesus was a carpenter's son in a small town. Jesus became an itinerant preacher (there were many in those days); he attracted a small following (12 untutored men); and his life was snuffed out one Friday for disturbing the peace. That was all, measured by the usual canons of history.

For two thousand years, Jesus has haunted the world. Other famous people have taken their quiet places on the dusty shelves of libraries, and no longer trouble the world – Alexander, Genghis Khan, Nero, Napoleon. But not Jesus of Nazareth. Hundreds of millions of people throughout the centuries have lived and died for Jesus. And today, in this 21st century, Jesus bids to be the only candidate for the loyalty of the whole world.

The church that bears the name of Jesus is the most international movement of the day. It does not win the applause of people everywhere. The church has been, and still is, under attack. But not the Lord of the church. Pilate's verdict, "I find no fault in him," has been the unqualified verdict of the world ever since Jesus lived among us.

If any other part of the biblical story is to become credible at all, we will have to let the life, work, and person of Jesus be the clue. Jesus walked the earth. There are four biographies left to us: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Read them as if you had never read them before. Let Jesus become your companion as you read. Let the full force of his person strike you. It will dawn on you that if any person ever represented what someone in the fullness of humanity ought to be, Jesus is that person.
