From the Pastor's Desk Pastor Dick Hotchkin

February is a month in which we will all hear a lot about love. The Hallmark movies will especially feature love during February. Please allow me to share a few thoughts on the subject of love.

Love is not the means to an end. Love is the end itself. If we use love to achieve some other end, we destroy love.

Not even God uses love to manipulate people. Whether we return God's love, whether we are grateful for God's love, whether we in turn love anyone – God keeps on loving us. This is the biblical picture of God, the God revealed in Jesus. God loves us even when we hurt God, as we do with our ingratitude and willfulness. This is the staggering message of the Christian gospel.

It is God's nature to love. If love fails utterly to win us, God still loves us. God has no other nature but love. God's love has no partiality. God has the same love for the prodigal who squanders his inheritance as for the brother who dutifully manages the farm; the same love for an Apostle named Paul who rejoices God's heart as for a tyrant named Nero who breaks God's heart; the same love for a St. Francis who helps people as for a Hitler who destroys people; in a sense, the same love for God's lost children in hell as for God's jubilant children in heaven.

God's deepest wish for us human beings is that we may catch on to this kind of love, and have it become our way of life. Only a few great souls have reached this grace in any large measure, but whenever we are able to reach out to others with no thought of gain, no purpose of changing anyone, but simply to love as we have been loved – then we touch the secret of God's amazing realm.

Great World Religions: Judaism, Christianity, Islam, Hinduism and Buddhism

Beginning Wednesday February 5th

I will be offering a DVD based Great Courses class on the **Great World Religions:** Judaism, Christianity, Islam, Hinduism and Buddhism. Each class session will consist of two half hour lectures presented by a different scholar for each world religion plus time for discussion and questions. We can expect most classes to last from 1 to 1 ½ hours. There is enough material to cover 30 hours worth of lectures, which is about the amount of time you might spend attending a Seminary comparative religions course. We'll take it one religion at a time, and if there is enough interest, continue through all or most of the lectures. This could easily take us through the rest of winter, spring and on through most of next fall (not including June - August). We might finish sooner if I decide to skip some of the lectures.

The class will be held on Wednesday afternoons at 1:15 pm either in the Board of Directors meeting room or in the Fellowship Hall depending on how many are interested, beginning Wednesday, February 5. Treasurer's Report Denise Fusina

In contrast to the expected 2024 deficit of \$101,868, the year 2024 ended positively with a net income of \$4,005. This positive shift was due to a few things - most importantly, your generosity.

- Thanks to members' increased giving, the General Fund Pledges were \$15,000 over the original expectation.
- Comstock Endowment distribution of \$50,000 was not included in the 2024 Budget.
- Mission Pledges received, \$15,724, were saved for future Mission needs.
- Comstock Innovative Grant was partially used, allowing \$9,662 to be used in 2025.
- Dividends and Capital Gains were \$8,500 over budget.

While the overall income was positive, the General Fund deficit was actually \$19,818, which has reduced our Reserve Fund.

There is more work to be done going forward, and a great start is the \$15,000 plus increased 2025 Pledge.

Your increased giving along with consolidated spending and grant receipts have allowed us to plan for a balanced budget this year. That is a long way from the \$100,000 deficit of last year.

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

Sunday February, 23, 2025 (Following Worship)

Purpose: To elect a seven member <u>Search Committee</u>.

Board Highlights

- The board thanked former Office Administrator, Nancy Ross, and welcomed Leslie Reynolds as her replacement.
- The board recognized Denise Fusina, Dennis Artley and Joe Garant for their involvement in resolving 2024 deficits to end the year with a positive balance.
- The board continues discussion about pastor's housing and the work to find a resolution to the pending lease expiration at the end of February.
- Plans for an event to celebrate the dedication of the new piano donated by Ann and Blair Diamond in memory of their mother, Barbara Diamond, in whose memory the piano was purchased.
- The board voted to purchase new name tags for the congregation after the Annual Meeting takes place.
- The board appreciates the ability for online donations to be given and noted the platform is being used.
- The Search Committee's work will begin after the Annual Meeting by first concentrating on the church profile.

Annual Meeting

Many thanks to all who joined us for and participated in our 163rd Annual Meeting of the Congregation on Sunday, January 26. Making our voices heard and sharing our ideas, concerns, and hopes are paramount to the continued success of our church. Additional copies of the 2024 Annual Report are available on the table at the back of the sanctuary and in the church office.



- Moderator, Jay Kettler, called the meeting to order in the church sanctuary.
- Minutes of the January 28, 2024 Annual Meeting and September 15, 2025 Special Meeting were approved.
- The Clerk, Vicky Lindsay, reported membership as of December 31, 1024 stands at 95 Members.
- Dennis Artley, Budget/Finance Committee Chair, shared simplified, easier to read reports noting "2024 was a great year." Starting the year with a \$101,868 deficit, the year ended with a surplus of \$4,005. This was possible with an additional \$15,000 in pledges, significant increased investment income and Community Foundation funds used to help balance the budget. The financial report for 2024 was approved.
- The 2025 budget was presented reflecting proposed income (totaling \$281,155) and proposed expenses (totaling \$280,290). The 2025 budget was approved.
- The Special Funds Report was shared which reflects repositioned investments (sold at a gain) which nearly doubled our Legacy and Memorial Funds. The Comstock Fund is also in good standing. The Special Funds Report was approved.
- Ann Gerow, representing the Nominating Committee, presented the Elected Positions Report. She noted one change impacts the Historian position which will now be handled by the work of a committee. With no additional nominations, the elected positions were approved.
- Rev. Hotchkin discussed the number of pledging units, noting that we have received 48 pledges of 69 possible pledging units. He shared that most churches see 10% of membership that do not pledge. He also pointed out the importance of the Search Committee's work to continue searching for a new pastor. He asked the congregation to support the important work of the Search Committee. Timely reports will be shared as the process unfolds.
